Harmonising global standards

- Different sustainability standards in different regions -Europe, USA, Asia
- The GSTC MICE criteria aim to harmonise different standards under a single global framework
- Ensures that the criteria are applicable worldwide and create a common basis for sustainability in tourism
- Creates a common language for sustainability that makes it easier for international stakeholders to work together and implement these practices effectively







Global benchmark for sustainability

- Offering a structured framework to:
 - Reduce negative impacts on the environment
 - Maximise social and economic benefits for the communities
 - Enhance cultural heritage
 - Ensure effective sustainability planning





Based on the four pillars of sustainability:

- (1) Sustainable management
 - SECTION A: Demonstrate effective sustainable management
- (2) Social and economic benefit
 - SECTION B: Maximise social and economic benefits and minimise negative impacts
- (3) Cultural heritage
 - SECTION C: Maximise benefits to cultural heritage and minimise negative impacts
- (4) Environment
- SECTION D: Maximise benefits to the environment and minimise negative impacts

Example low hanging fruits - Event organisers

- 1. A1: Sustainability Policy and Plan: Formulate a comprehensive sustainability policy, including measurable objectives and a review mechanism.
- 2. A3.1: "The event organiser is in compliance with all applicable local and national laws and regulations in all countries of operation, including among others, health, safety, labor, and environmental aspects."
- 3. A5.2: "Staff and volunteers receive guidance and training regarding their roles and responsibilities with respect to sustainability policies, plans, and practices. Records of training or guidance are available."
- 4. D1.1.5: "The event organiser has specific annual reduction targets for energy consumption for its events (calculated as total consumption divided by the number of attendees) and for its office operations."
- 5. D1.2.2: "The event organiser measures the water used in its office and requests consumption data for its events from the venues and other suppliers with significant water usage."
- 6. D2.1.2: "The event organiser measures GHG emissions from its office and event operations and the emissions over which it has direct influence or control."
- 7. D2.2.3: "The event organiser promotes the use of public and shared transportation for event attendees and staff."

- 8. D2.4.2: "The event organiser has a solid waste management plan for its events that includes measures for waste prevention, reduction, reuse, recycling, energy recovery, and disposal."
- 9. D2.5.4: "The event organiser substitutes the use of harmful substances in its office operations with environmentally certified alternatives when available.."
- 10. A4.2: "The event organiser publishes an annual sustainability performance report online, shares it with all stakeholders, and makes the report available in an offline format upon request."
- 11. B1.1: "The event organiser supports the local community financially or inkind, in the location where it is based or in the location where the majority of its events occur, in areas of need identified by the local community."
- 12. B4.1: "The activities of the event organiser do not restrict local access to livelihoods, including land and aquatic resource use."
- 13. B5.1: "The code of conduct reflects the event organiser's policies regarding exploitation, harassment, and human trafficking."
- 14. B7.1: "The event organiser incorporates access for people with disabilities, pregnant and nursing mothers, people with allergies, and the elderly into the event design."
- 15. B9.1: "The event organiser complies with International Labor Organization (ILO) standards and regulations."
